FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Students, Parents and Guardians,

Our official awards evening will be held on Thursday 17th December this year recognising the many high level achievements of our students. However, there are some outstanding levels of student achievement happening at the moment that deserve both acknowledgement and celebration in our College community.

Very much on the radar for high achievement this year is our student debating teams. The College has entered two teams in the D Grade, the category for Years 7, 8 and 9 competition, and one in the C Grade (Year 10) competition.

Starting off in the field of 881 teams in Victoria, the D Graders finished undefeated and top of the ladder in the Watsonia region of 40 teams. Our C Graders, one of 420 teams, also finished undefeated on top of the ladder in the Watsonia region of 20 teams.

Both teams progressed to the State level, with both teams achieving success in the early rounds against Arrarat College (C Grade) and St Francis Xavier (D Grade). In the 'Octo Finals' the C Grade team was defeated by one point by quality opposition from Scotch College. The D Grade team had a six point win over St Bernard's Grammar and continued on to compete in the Quarter Finals against St Patrick's

These students have prepared and practiced for the tournament every Wednesday since March and they were selected based on creative responses to a range of intricate questions. Each of these students has been a motivated and passionate team member committed to the pursuit of applied technology. The two staff members who have worked with the team in a support role have been Mathew Dean and Natalie McDonnell and Mathew accompanied the students to the actual tournament held at La Trobe University on the 23rd August. These students have certainly embraced and epitomised our six core College values of Teamwork, Trust, Achievement, Courage, Friendship and Happiness in this pursuit of technological and academic excellence.

Last Thursday at the College we held interviews for architects and project managers in relation to our \$14million refurbishment and rebuild of the school as per the recent State Government election promise. Excitingly we are very close to a decision and now the process will begin. At this stage we do not anticipate any building works or site development until later next year. I will keep our community informed of developments and part of the brief is that there will be no disruption to the teaching or educational program of our students.

On the 24th and 25th August, and after a rigorous process involving applications, speeches, staff and student voting and interviews before a large panel, we have appointed our four College Captains for 2016. We have followed a merit-based process and congratulations to Madison Carroll, Brittany Fiddes, Melony Jones and Tully Scales. We interviewed eight outstanding candidates for the four positions and the voting was extremely close and the other four students have also been

congratulated for their achievements and for presenting so well.

Also, following an application and interview process, Callum Dorsett, Ryan Gardner, Jack Penrose and Chloe Robinson have been appointed as Middle School Captains for 2016. Congratulations to all of these students.

Berthe Mouchette Competition Alliance rangate de Melbourne

An excursion in year 12 is often a rare occurrence. The idea of leaving school and our studies behind for the day filled us with excitement and after working our way down to Alliance Française de Melbourne this idea became reality for Monty's Year 12 French students who were partaking in the 2015 Berthe Mouchette competition. The competition consisted of a reading, writing and listening component. In addition, we were required to have an 8 minute conversation, in French of course, which was divided up into two sections, 4 minutes of general conversation, and 4 minutes talking about a topic of the student's choice. A common topic discussed was technology and the impact it has on the French youth. The idea of a conversation in a foreign language evoked feelings of nervousness and angst within all of us, however many found that the examiners weren't as scary as previously thought. What was considered a terrifying experience at first ultimately panned out to be a comfortable and knowledgeable experience as it gave us insight into what is expected from us at the final end of year exam.

Berthe Mouchette Competition Finalist

Early August, our Year 12 students took part in the Berthe Mouchette competition organized by the Alliance Française de Melbourne, in St Kilda.

Once there, each student took an oral exam similar to the one they will undertake at the end of Year 12 for their VCE exam. This speaking exam consists of a general conversation and a detailed study, a topic they introduce, followed by a discussion on that matter.

There are several schools participating in this competition, with a total of 1636 Victorian students at this level.

Not only did ALL our Year 12 French students do well, but one in particular stood out: LUKE MUSCAT. Luke is in the top 100 finalists of the whole state, with a perfect score – which means they could not fault him on anything.

This is an outstanding achievement, particularly for someone who has never been to France.

Luke will engage in a 4-minute general conversation this Sunday morning, for the Finals. A certificate and French books are at stake for millions of candidates, and there is even a trip to New Caledonia for the winners of the Prix La Pérouse in years 11 and 12.

2016 VCAL/VET/SBAT APPLICATIONS

In 2015 we have over 45 students enrolled in our VCAL program. All students undertake units in: Personal Development, Work Related Skills, Literacy, Numeracy & the option of VCE Units. VCAL students complete their Industry Specific Skills strand one day a week. This is achieved through the completion of a Certificate II or III **TAFE** course, or **SCHOOL BASED APPRENTICESHIP OR TRAINEESHIP**.

Students are enrolled in TAFE courses as varied as: Building & Construction, Music, Business Administration, Shop fitting, Engineering, Hairdressing, Beauty and Automotive. School Based Apprentices have been placed in Childcare, Building & Construction and Hospitality and Business Administration. Any student undertaking a VET/SBAT will need to acquire a USI (Unique Student Identifier). This is completed online and you will be given a 10 digit code.

LEADERSHIP OPPORTUNITY


