FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents, Guardians and Students,

On Friday 26th August I was invited by the Regional Director (NWVR), Simon Milligan, to the Official introduction of the 'Marrung' Aboriginal Education Plan 2016-2026 that has been crafted and funded by the State Government. This was held at the Aborigines Advancement League in Thornbury and was a most impressive event. What was even more impressive was that an important part of the event included a panel discussion by six members of the wider Aboriginal and education community and this included Julia Bruhn, one of our current Year 11 students. Julia gave a wonderful presentation from the perspective of a student in relation to the Marrung initiatives and was certainly an outstanding ambassador for Montmorency Secondary College. Her biography presented in the program reads:



Julia Bruhn – Young Person

Julia is currently completing Year 11 at Montmorency Secondary College. This year she is completing English, Art, History and Legal Studies, as well as two subjects at a Year 12 level – Media and Psychology. She has been the recipient of the Darby McCarthy scholarship, which includes work experience with Racing Victoria; she hopes to gain experience in the media and communications industry from this. She has been a member of the Koori Academy of excellence – a program assisting Koori students to remain engaged in education and complete Year 12, and to excel and pursue their desired tertiary pathways – since its inception in 2012. Her hobbies include camping, skiing and tennis.

Congratulations to Julia for her outstanding achievements as a student and also her most impressive contribution to the Koori Academy of Excellence and the 'Marrung' Aboriginal Education Plan.

On Thursday 11th August we held a Curriculum Day which provided valuable professional development for our whole staff. Our focus this year was the FISO (Framework for Improving Student Outcomes), the new State Government focus for assisting school improvement. This included a key note presentation by our Senior Education Improvement Leader (SEIL) from the NWVR, Silvana Sena. In the afternoon our staff undertook the Anaphylaxis training module which all staff in schools now have to complete. Congratulations to Assistant Principal, Clara Rocca, and Leading Teacher, Glenn Blackmore, for organising this very structured and worthwhile day of Professional Development for staff.

On Friday 26th August the 'House Off', our annual house competition talent quest was held and again it proved to be a most successful event. This day certainly showcased some amazing artistic and stage talent of our students and even that of many staff members. Congratulations to Assistant Principal, Mark Lohrey, and teacher Kerryn Murray who worked tirelessly again to ensure such a high standard and level of achievement and entertainment by everyone involved. Also, huge congratulations to the students and staff of Darebin House who were the overall winners of the competition.

On Wednesday 7th September, our student leaders conducted another highly impressive whole school assembly. An extensive agenda covered many presentations and this included a special presentation to the College of \$50,000 worth of Technogym equipment by Savva

Sherbourne Primary Schools. We have had wonderful feedback about these events and congratulations to Clara Rocca and Michelle Clark for their hard work and excellent organisation of both days.

The tender design phase of our \$14m College Redevelopment and Building Program is almost complete and approval from the department for us to go out to tender is imminent. We continue to hold many necessary meetings with the Department and Architect Committees and the logistics of College operation will be very interesting in 2017. On a very positive logistical note we have secured a brand new, currently on the production line, 5 Mod (2 rooms) relocatable classroom building due to our increasing enrolments for 2017.

On Saturday 20th August and Saturday 10th September we held two annual Presentation Balls at the Melrose Reception Centre, the 28th consecutive year for these events. Nineteen, and then twenty, pairs of Year 11 students, together with family, friends and College staff have again showcased splendid celebrations in two wonderful College and community events.

A special thank you to organisers, Jennie Siede and Leanne Johnson, who have now run our presentation balls for 21 years and they always produce a superb and enjoyable event. Also a big thank you to Julie Ryan, who has taught the 'dance moves' to our debutantes for the past 26 years, and, as on these Saturday evenings, presented them in spectacular fashion.

On Thursday 8th September our Athletics Team competed in the Northern Metropolitan Region Athletics Competition. Our team consisted of 24 students who were in 26 individual events and one relay team. Our students won 21 medals and Montmorency was placed a most creditable 8th overall from 40 secondary schools that competed. On our team there were many outstanding efforts and congratulations to Emily Butler of Year 10, who won four gold and one silver medal. Nine of our students have now qualified to compete at the state Finals in 10 individual and one relay events. Our State Finalists are Emily Butler, James Curry, Callum Dunn, Ryan Hoffman, Mayson Hoverd, Fraser Jones, Yeon Chan Lee, Daniil Rauzin and Charles Stephens.

The last week of Term 3 has certainly been action-packed and eventful for our students. On Sunday morning, teachers, Michelle Bijkersma and Mathew Dean, left for Japan with ten students for a Japanese study and cultural tour. On Tuesday we held our very wellattended *Student Progress Interview Day and Evening*, which provided an important opportunity for constructive and timely feedback for both students and their parents. On Wednesday, teachers, Marjory Creta-Ireland and Steve Horn departed to Noumea with nine students on a French study tour. Also in this last week it has been *Science Week* and our Science staff, led by Faculty Leader, Kati Stone, have held a number of impressive Science activities for Years 7 to 9. This has included a 'reptile incursion' for our Years 7 classes, a 'bridge building' competition for Year 8 classes and the 'Bad Science Show' for Year 9 students. Our Science faculty has also conducted a Science workshop for 26 Grade 5 and 6 primary students from local schools.

We now look forward to an equally exciting Term 4 at the College.
