In recent weeks, we have held two very informative Mathematics Information Evenings conducted in the College Auditorium for parents and students. Our Year 7-9 evening was particularly well attended and both evenings have been conducted by Mathematics and Numeracy Leading Teacher, Steve Horn. The first was in relation to Years 10-12 Mathematics on Thursday 25th February and the second on the 3rd March was for Years 7-9 Mathematics. Steve delivered two very insightful presentations outlining curriculum and teaching and learning practices in the Mathematics Learning Area. The parents attending then had the opportunity to discuss Maths at Monty with Members of the Faculty.

On Sunday 28th February, our English and Literacy Leading Teacher, Caitlin Penrose, was interviewed about the new VCE English Course for 2016/2017 on ABC radio. Caitlin has been involved at State Level on the Text Selection Panel and combined with the successes of our VCE English Program, she was invited by the Department of Education and the relevant authorities (VCAA) to be the Department's spokesperson on the Libby Gore program.

I would like to congratulate our Year 7 and Year 10 Student Leaders and also Junior School Leader, Sonia Culcasi and Assistant Principal, Clara Rocca for another inspirational annual 'Thinking *Carnival*' on Wednesday 16th March. More than 300 students from Greensborough, Watsonia North and Sherbourne Primary Schools were involved. All guests were female and those present at the breakfast were: Vicki Ward (MP), Cr Bronnie Hattam (Mayor of Nillumbik), Cr Helen Coleman (Deputy Mayor of Nillumbik), the 2015 DUXs from each year level, Middle School Captains, Senior School Captains, members of the Interact club, female teaching staff and former Pauline Toner Prize winner from 2015, Ruby Panozzo. Students from Eltham High School, Catholic Ladies College and St Helena also attended the breakfast.

A wide range of topics were discussed at the breakfast which included: gender parity, gender equality, changes which can be made and the well deserved future of hard working and dedicated women.

Dr Kylie Mason was the guest speaker at the breakfast and shared her inspiring story. Dr Kylie Mason is a clinical and laboratory haematologist from the Royal Melbourne Hospital and Walker and Eliza Hall Institute of Medical Research. In 2009, she received the Premier's Award for Medical Research. She was also the winner of the L'Oréal Women in Science Award in 2012.

The recipient of the 2016 Pauline Toner Award was a young woman who attends St Helena. She created a feminist collective and supports the lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and intersexual students at her school.

SWIMMING RESULTS

DISTRICT SWIMMING

On Friday 4th March, the Monty Swimming Team competed in the District Swimming Competition at Aquarena. Our 21 swimmers achieved eight 1st places, seven 2nd places, and twenty five 3rd places.

Several students set new District records (NR) or achieved Personal Best (PB) times. Madi Bickerton took nearly 4 seconds off her time (Monty Carnival) for the 50m Backstroke. Tara Kinder smashed the District 13y IM record by over 14 seconds, and bettered the District Record in the 50m Butterfly to narrowly miss first place. Ryan Leaper was just 4 seconds outside the District Record with his PB for second in the 50m backstroke. Jamie Kuhn cruised comfortably through each of his events, picking up a couple of records along the way.

First and second place-getters qualify to swim at the NMR competition to be held at WaterMarc on Tuesday 22nd March, 2016.

NORTHERN REGION SWIMMING

On Tuesday 22nd March, the Monty Swimming Team competed at the Northern Metropolitan Region Swimming Competition at WaterMarc. Our eight swimmers achieved seven 1st places, four 2nd places, and two 3rd places.

Andrew Rice won each of his three races: though he was challenged to narrowly win the 100m Freestyle, he was clearly in a class of his own in each of the 50m and 100m Backstroke races. Tara Kinder had a big program having qualified for five individual events . She too came up against very strong competitors in each of her shorter 50m races, winning one and narrowly coming second in three others, but she easily won the 200m Individual Medley. Jamie Kuhn achieved a first and a close second place in each of his shorter events, but, like Tara, he demonstrated superior endurance and technique to easily win the 200m IM by over 15m.

Sarah Street was highly competitive in each of her two individual events achieving a third place and a fourth place in close finishes. Ryan Leaper competed strongly in the 50m Backstroke and showed great potential being level with the leader at 30m before fading to third over the last few meters to more experienced swimmers. Logan Plant competed in the 200m Freestyle, swimming strongly against some older boys to achieve a very creditable fifth place.

Our Individual Medley Team (Molly Siede, Sarah Street, Tara Kinder and Lauren Giles) swam a good race to achieve fifth in a quality field.

First and second place-getters progress to swim at the SSV State Championships to be held at Melbourne Sports and Aquatic Centre on Tuesday 19th April (week 2 of term 2).

Congratulations to our three athletes who have qualified to contest seven events at State Championships.

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STUDENTS TRAVELLING ON PUBLIC TRANSPORT

All students aged 17 years and over who travel on public transport are required to obtain a Victorian Public Transport (VPT) Student Concession Card as proof of their concession entitlement.

Students must carry a VPT Student Concession Card with them at all times when travelling—this is proof of entitlement to travel on a concession fare on public transport.

To apply for a VPT Student Concession Card students must complete the application form which is available from the General Office, metropolitan premium train stations or online at ptv.vic.gov.au

Once the form is completed it must be authorised by the College and then lodged at a metropolitan premium train station who will issue the card (\$9 fee applies).
