FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents, Guardians and Students,

We are now into the third week of a very busy term 3 at the College and our semester two courses for students, including VCE Units 2 and 4 began across the College on Monday 17th June.

Last week, on Thursday 25th July, we held our annual Student-Led Conference Day, which follows on from mid-year exams and semester reports. This was a highly successful day giving our students a genuine voice and opportunity to focus once again on their learning goals and also to reflect realistically on their learning progress. At this conference, students also completed the Group 8: High Performing Schools Survey, which has a PoLT (Principles of Learning and Teaching) focus. This provides us with detailed and valuable data about their attitudes to all their classes and teachers. We are now in our fourteenth year of collecting this data and the feedback during this time has enabled the Leadership Team and the College to adjust or refocus the way we do things in a more timely and effective manner than is otherwise possible.

Also, last Thursday evening, we held our annual Senior School Course and Careers Expo which was very well supported by our current Year 9 and 10 students and their parents. Most of the main universities and tertiary institutions set up a Careers and Course Expo in the Resource Centre that ran throughout the evening and was shown a lot of interest by the students and their parents. Again we had former student, Sarah Regan, heading up the marketing team for La Trobe University.

The two separate course information sessions held in the Auditorium, for current Year 9 and Year 10 students, were most informative and very well presented by Deb Metcalfe, Michael Weeding and Matthew Bennett. Feedback on the night from both students and parents was very positive.

On Wednesday 17th and Thursday 18th June, our Principal Team, Numeracy and Literacy Leading Teachers and our Learning Specialist Teachers/Faculty Leaders attended the first two of eight training days for the Department's 'Professional Learning Communities' initiative. This was held at the Mantra, in Bell Street Preston, and together with four other Secondary Colleges, we have been funded for this by the Department. The ultimate aim of this is to enhance teacher practice and student outcomes and is one of the FISO initiatives as part of the new Victorian Teaching and Learning Model.

On Tuesday 30th July, a very well-attended evening in the Auditorium was held for parents of Year 7 and 8 students who have been invited to undertake Challenge and Bridging English, Mathematics and Science in 2020. This is the very successful enrichment program for our Year 8 and 9 students that has run for a number of years and the evening was overseen by Glenn Blackmore. Teachers, Steve Horn, Caitlin Penrose, Sonia Culcasi, James Atkin and Michelle Clark also presented perspectives on how this program operates. We also had outstanding presentations by a number of our students on their experiences and the value of the subjects. Congratulations to students Matilda Clark, Ashlyn Reeves, Louise van Putten, Harry Kayall, Patrick Reichenbach, Imogen Prictor and Jonathan Thompson, who also gave insightful presentations of their experiences as part of this program.

In the last week of Term 2, we held two primary school leadership days at Amberley in Lower Plenty. Under the guidance of Kim Faulkner and Hamish Yule many of our Year 7, 8 and 9 SRC students conducted a range of leadership training activities with students from Watsonia Heights, Montmorency South, Greenhills and Streeton Primary Schools. This included the low ropes course and many other team building activities.

We have held two very impressive Whole School Assemblies that have also been attended by College Council President, Shane Penrose. On Tuesday 18th June, there was a great variety of reports on significant events by our students which included the Year 8 Camp experience, the Borneo Tour, the Year 11 Photography Camp and also the Year 9 Camp and a student performance. I also introduced the College redevelopment project media video by James Merlino. The big picture item by our students was to do with "Pink Week" and the Pink Fashion Show as most entertaining, helping to launch a week of fund raising activities for BCNA (Breast Cancer Network Australia).

The assembly on Tuesday 30th July was also very impressive with an outstanding performance by the school choir of "Healing Hands". There was a report on the successful "Pink Week" by Chayla Reeves. Impressively our students have raised almost \$7,000 for BCNA and our whole school community has embraced this most worthy cause. We were then given an outstanding presentation by Amy Theyer, an ambassador for the Beyond Blue organisation, and this speaker was arranged by Amy Gersh of Year 10. Again, well done to Kim Faulkner and our student leaders for two quality assemblies.

On Tuesday, 23rd June, we held interviews with three architect companies nominated by the Department of Education, for our \$16.1m Basketball Stadium re-development. The panel comprised Bruno Imeneo (VSBA DE&T Representative), Greg Jeffers (Eltham Wildcats Basketball, Chief Executive Officer) and myself. We are very close to a decision and appointment of the architects.

2020 VCAL/VET/SBAT APPLICATIONS

In 2019 we have over 45 students enrolled in our VCAL program. All students undertake units in: Personal Development, Work Related Skills, Literacy & Numeracy. VCAL students complete their Industry Specific Skills strand one day a week. This is achieved through the completion of a Certificate II or III **VET** course, or **SCHOOL BASED APPRENTICESHIP OR TRAINEESHIP**.

Students are enrolled in TAFE courses as varied as: Building & Construction, Music, Business Administration, Shop fitting, Engineering, Hairdressing, Beauty and Automotive. School Based Apprentices have been placed in Childcare, Building & Construction, Hospitality and Business Administration. Please refer to the link on <u>www.montmorencycareers.com</u>

Any student undertaking a VET/SBAT will need to acquire a USI (Unique Student Identifier). This is completed online and you will be given a 10 digit code. Go to > <u>www.usi.gov.au</u>

VCAL students also undertake WORK-PLACEMENT in industries aligned with their TAFE certificates.

We are seeking expressions of interest from students at this early stage to establish VET/SBAT opportunities that arise. All students applying for VCAL will need to attend an interview. Students who will be moving into Year 11 or 12 in 2019 interested in undertaking VCAL, VET or SBAT next year need to collect an expression of interest form from Mr Weeding in the VCAL Office.

NESPRESSO RECYCLING PROGRAM


For all you coffee drinkers out there, Montmorency Secondary College has organised to be a collection point for Nespresso coffee capsules.

Unfortunately, domestic recycling systems in Australia are currently unable to effectively sort and recycle small items, such as aluminium coffee capsules so Nespresso has established its own recycling system for used capsules. So don't throw your capsules in the rubbish, they can be dropped into the cardboard recycling bins at the General Office. This service is specifically for aluminium capsules only – no plastic.

Once collected, the used coffee is sent to an industrial composting facility to be transformed into compost. The aluminium is recycled and sent back to the aluminium industry to produce new products.

Who can apply for Aspire

A successful Aspire applicant can look like many different things. Perhaps you're the coach of a sports team or volunteer regularly at your local nursing home. Maybe you're the leader of a fundraising group for your school or even go above and beyond to help your family.

Overall, La Trobe looks for applicants who have gained skills, knowledge and experience through volunteering or making a positive contribution to their community.

Aspire is open to current domestic and onshore international Year 12 students and non-Year 12 students.

Eligibility criteria

To receive an early conditional offer through Aspire as a Year 12 student, you must:

- apply direct to La Trobe's Aspire Program and via VTAC/UAC
- be a domestic Year 12 student
- be an Australian or New Zealand citizen or permanent resident, or an onshore international student currently studying Year 12 in Australia.

Aspire scholarships

As part of the Aspire program, you'll automatically be considered for one of 40 available Aspire scholarships. Scholarships are valued at \$5000 per year for up to four years of study (including Honours). Starting in 2020, scholarships will be awarded to the highest-achieving Aspire students in their individual course with a minimum ATAR of 80.

DOES YOUR CHILD NEED TO LEAVE SCHOOL EARLY???

Students are not permitted to leave the school grounds during the school day without permission. It is expected that students will make dental, medical and other appointments outside school hours wherever possible. However, we understand that this is not always possible. If your child needs to leave school early for any reason, we ask that you follow College procedure set out below:

- 1. Please provide you child with a note requesting permission for your child to leave school at the specified time.
- 2. Upon arrival at school, the student is to take the note to their Level Coordinator, who will then sign the note and return it to the student.
- 3. The student can then present the note to their class teacher when they need to leave.
- 4. Once the student leaves the class they will present the note to the General Office staff and sign the "Early Leavers" record. The office staff will retain the note for attendance recording.
- 5. If you child needs to return to school later in the day, they should report to the General Office and sign in.

It is important for all students and teachers that class interruptions are kept to a minimum. Wherever possible, parent/ guardians are asked to avoid telephoning the College in order to have their child paged or dismissed from class and follow the above procedures instead.

ARRIVING LATE TO SCHOOL

- Students who arrive after the class roll has been taken (after Home Group) should report to the General Office to sign in and collect a Late Pass.
- A note from a Parent/Guardian explaining the lateness should be provided to the office staff, or, alternatively, the Parent/Guardian should telephone the General Office providing a reason for their child's late arrival.

SICK BAY AND FIRST AID

Students who become ill should advise their classroom teacher that they are feeling unwell and receive permission to go to Sick Bay which is located in the General Office. Students will be attended to by the School Nurse and if necessary parents will be contacted.

It is important that a current emergency phone number is listed on each student's school record. Any change to the home address, work address, telephone numbers or emergency contact should be provided to the Office immediately.

We encourage students not to use their mobile phones to contact parents directly during class time, and for the convenience of all involved ask students to follow the above procedure.
